## **In the beginning God created the heavens and the earth (Genesis 1:1)“**

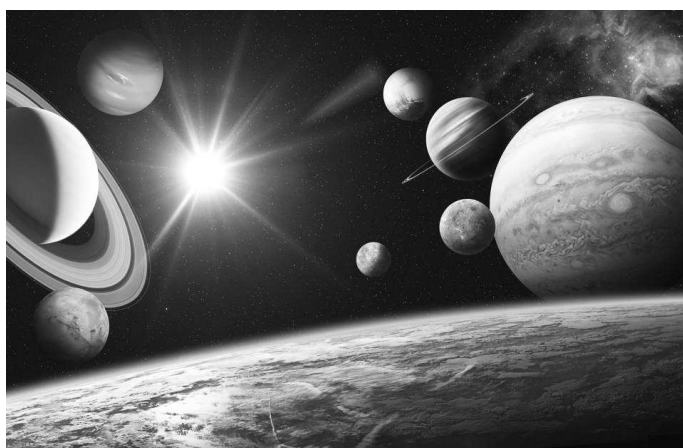

# MOUNTAIN MOVING FAITH

It may not be a very uncommon experience that when we plan to go for worship on a Sunday or when we are getting ready to attend an important prayer meeting, we face unexpected guests arriving at home after long years, or we have a sudden attack of cold and feverishness, or our child falls on the ground and have a bleeding injury in his head which needed immediate suturing and the list can go on and on....

But we must understand that even though these sort of outward circumstances prevent us from attending a prayer meeting, there are as many inward things limiting the effectiveness of our praying. Since these are less easily discerned than the circumstantial hindrances, the Holy Spirit must alert us to them. The outward circumstances may hold us back from attending a meeting, but it is the inward things that cause us to fall short of God's expectations.

One of the inner ways by which we may

disappoint God is by not acting out our Faith, which we have as Children of God. It is one thing to 'have' Faith and another to 'act' on that Faith. This is like having a powerful weapon but refusing to use it against an enemy. That is, having the 'Attitude of faith' but not the 'Act of faith'.

Luke 8:22-25 illustrates the difference between these two concepts. Jesus and his disciples were crossing the lake. During the passage, Jesus fell asleep. Suddenly a violent storm came sweeping down over the lake, threatening their safety. The disciples hastened to rouse their master, terrified that all their hopes finish up at the bottom of the lake. Rising from his sleep, Jesus rebuked the storm and ended the threat. Asleep, Jesus demonstrated the attitude of faith. Because of His faith in God, the Father, Jesus had no fear in His heart and was able to sleep comfortably both before the storm and during the storm. Awake, Jesus by an act of faith, silenced

the storm and averted the danger. Such an act was required to remove the threat from their situation and to make it possible for them to resume their course.

The purpose of the Holy Spirit in recording this dramatic incident may not be just to demonstrate the mighty power of the Lord Jesus and His success in controlling the raging storms and the waves but to focus

adequate action. Every mentor rejoices when he sees his disciple not only hears, understands what he has been taught but acts accordingly. Jesus was training the twelve for the day when he would no longer be physically available to them. He knew that after He would leave them, they, as messengers of the Gospel will have to face more violent storms and persecutions. The



assaults that he is facing in His ministry will be concentrated on them. He was teaching them that He could sleep in the midst of the violent storm

on the failure of the disciples. This is borne out by the question Jesus asked them after the confusion subsided: "Where is your faith?" It seems to indicate that He was surprised at their failure to exercise their faith themselves. The question implied that He believed they could have taken the initiative and by an act of faith saved themselves.

All training is designed to equip for

because of the faith He had on His Father God. That is how a disciple would need to be, when assaults come upon him. Not to be unnecessarily perturbed but face all situations calmly fully hoping no evil would overcome him. "For thus says the LORD of hosts; He who touches you, touches the apple of my eye" (Zach 2:8).

When we face trials and persecutions it may look, as the disciples thought that

day, that the Lord is apparently not caring about us (Sleeping!). But at the time when they were in crisis, He, in fact, was really in the boat sharing their situation, and likewise will always be with us as He has promised and would be ready to rescue us whenever we might need His help. However, as their teacher, as any teacher would, He would have rejoiced if they themselves rebuked the calamity calming storm and controlled the situation. He probably felt annoyed that their 'professed faith' had not progressed to an 'acting faith' (faith in action), where they should have taken the initiative and acted.

Even as Jesus shared the boat with his disciples, so He is with us in all our troubles. He may be undiscerned by the natural eye, but nevertheless he is available when we cry to him in our need. And often, when some troubles make us desperate, because we have not acted in faith, he would like to ask us the same question: "Where is your faith?" He expects us to draw out our spiritual weapons and go into action as responsible, resolute men, not to come storming hysterically into his throne room like helpless, frightened children.

Some may argue that since God is omniscient and omnipotent, it would be better for us when we face difficulties and

go through tribulations to remain passive, to just put our trust in him and let him work out the circumstances in His way and in His time. But it is not God's will as supreme ruler to overthrow all the forces of evil by the might of his omnipotent arm alone. He wishes that His Children as His representatives should be partakers of His divine nature and fight and win over these evil forces.

In the work of creation, God needed no help. He spoke and the stars of heaven were formed and settled into their appointed places. However, in his redemptive activity and in maintenance of the earth which He created, God does not work alone. His wish is that the men He redeemed shall embody his will on earth.

In a football game, if we are in God's team A, competing with the Satan's team B, and if we know for sure, our Captain, who is our Goal keeper (GOD) will thwart all the best efforts of the B team players and will never allow them to score a goal, should that make us, the players in God's team to be complacent and be like men sitting as spectators on the sidelines? Of course, team B will not score any point, but neither we in team A, because of our complacency. Further for the onlookers, the struggle the B team players exhibit to somehow score a

goal, will be more impressive than the callous attitude of our team A players.

We never hesitate to tell God all about our difficulties. We describe it for him, explain how it all happened and what it is doing to hinder our work. We believe in prayer but many times, we are apologetic, not dynamic. We are fervent in prayer but feeble in action in the conflict with Satan.



In Mark 11:23, Jesus lays down His formula for dealing with unsurmountable problems and difficulties which He compares with a mountain. He specifies a case in which the attitude of faith of a disciple must extend itself into an act of faith. "(You) Say unto this mountain Be thou removed, and be

thou cast into the sea". Many mountains obstruct the progress of God's work in the world today. As long as the mountains persist, we will never be able to see what God has for us on the other side. We busy ourselves praying about the mountains but Jesus teaches us that we shouldn't expect God to move the mountains but our faith must be expressed in directives issued to

mountains. We ask the mountain to move! We need to understand our faith should not be just a good spiritual character but it should be a spiritual force in the work and warfare of God. Don't misunderstand this fact. Our calling and function is not to replace God, but to release him. It is this determination and prayer that unlocks the door of God's self-imposed

limitation and frees him to move out into the situation and execute his will.

It has been rightly said, "Without God man cannot; without man God will not."

## Death and Cremation

To announce a death, the announcers go to the villages, each carrying a small stick (Thunakkar). The two closest people bring a jug of water from the river. They say the name of the deceased three times without looking left or right and dip the jug in the water.



Grinded turmeric mixed with the flour in the kumbha water is sprinkled on the corpse. After that, it is laid on a Katta (a bed made of bamboo). A small Shapparapanthal is tied around the bed and the upper part is covered with a cloth. A Montha (a vessel) is placed on a long bamboo. The corpse is completely covered with a white cloth. A coin is placed

on the forehead.

Shapparayattam "The relatives and friends who gather after receiving the announcement resolve the disputes and financial transactions of the deceased and give him a release. If the thali is not tied, this is also done then. Then they chant and dance with a chorus. God created and cared for human beings. The chant is an expression of gratitude for raising God's children without any deficiency. They express through gestures that God gave, and God took. Chanting is essential in funerals. This chanting continues usually for 4 days until the body is taken to the burning ghat.

Mantrikkoottam "The Mantrikkoottam (Panchayat) consists of the Kurutala, Wanderi, Manneerkaran, caste chiefs and elders. They meet to settle legal matters after death. If the deceased is a wife who did not tie a Thali, the husband should tie it on her body. If the husband is deceased, the next of kin should tie a Thali. Those who come to the funeral are given food on the banks of a river or stream. If the deceased is the husband, seven people from the family break the wife's thali. If the deceased is a wife, the husband cuts off the hair from the front of the head.



After the Afetr the Panchayat met to complete the obligations and rituals, the body is taken to the Chudalakadu on a wooden coffin. Before that, the clothes that were wrapped around the body are removed. If the relatives do not come for the funeral due to a quarrel



or dispute, the villagers take the initiative and conduct a funeral procession and take the body to the Chudalakadu. The funeral performed by the villagers in this way is called Oorushapara. After burying the body, the people return. If they are Irulas, they go home and take some grass from the roof and burn it to warm their toes. Then they fill a vessel with water at the threshold of the house. A small stick is dipped in Castor oil or Til oil, and two drops of oil are poured into this water. The name of the deceased should be said when the first drop falls. When the second drop falls, the name of the father

is uttered. When these two drops coincide, the head of the family touches the combined oil and places it on his forehead. This continues until the two drops meet. This is called Nizhalkuthu. Only after bathing does anyone enter the house. Before the body is brought to the crematorium, it is placed in the Kainappilli (a place where the body is kept) outside the village. Here, the deceased's wife's thali, bangles and other ornaments are broken. This is a widowhood ceremony.

If the father dies, the eldest son shaves his head, and if the mother dies, the youngest son shaves his head. If there are no sons, who are related as sons will do the same in the same order. The husband should spend the rest of his life in the same way as was seen by his wife at the time of her death. Otherwise, it is believed that when they meet each other after death, they will not understand each other. After the death of those involved, they keep themselves away from temples and social rituals for six months to two years.

Literacy“The Irular are comparatively more literate and educated than other tribals. They are eager to learn. Tribal Mission is working tirelessly to shed light on the darkness in the lives of the Irula. As a result of the work of this mission, the miraculous light of the gospel has been shed on the darkness of many Irula families

### **Camp for children**

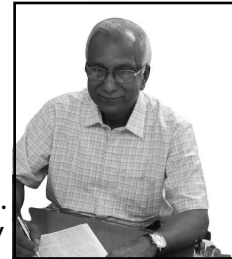

# A Vision Realized: Dedication of the New School Building in Rajasthan

The Tribal Mission's first outreach centre in North India was established in Bijori village, Rajasthan, among the Bhil tribe. It was here that Bro. Gautam Lal, the youngest son of the tribal chief, encountered the gospel and accepted the Lord Jesus Christ. He later married Suguna, and together they were appointed as missionaries to serve their own community.

Through their faithful ministry, other seven children of the tribal chief—and many others—came to know the Lord. Worship gatherings began in Gautam Lal's humble mud house, and as the congregation grew, the need for a dedicated church building became evident. By God's grace, this need was met. During a Sunday worship service, I asked the congregation to raise their hands if they could read and write. Out of the large gathering, only four responded. This moment underscored the urgent need for education, and our Executive Committee approved the establishment of an English Medium Primary School.

In 2016, Bro. Gautam Lal completed the necessary government formalities and obtained official sanction. The school began in 2017 within the church building with 35 children under the leadership of Mr. Govan Damor (B.A., B.Ed.) as Headmaster. Over the years, enrollment grew to nearly 150 students across grades 1 to 5.

As per government regulations, a separate

building was required to continue operating the school. In a remarkable act of generosity, a relative of Bro. Gautam Lal donated a suitable plot of land in the same area. Pr. Thomas Mathew, a friend of Tribal Mission, and his family, contributed to construct a new school building.

On August 2, 2025, the beautifully constructed school—featuring five classrooms and an office—was dedicated to the glory of God. I had the privilege of attending the dedication service along with Dr. K.M. Samuel. The school now employs five teachers and one Aya, and we anticipate further growth in student enrollment this year.

Our ministry continues to expand across Rajasthan, Madhya Pradesh, and Gujarat, with 14 mission centres where tribal communities worship the Lord in spirit and truth.

On behalf of Tribal Mission, I extend heartfelt thanks to Pr. Thomas Mathew and his family for their invaluable support. On the day of the dedication, 35 members of the Bhil tribe publicly declared their faith through water baptism, following a gathering of believers from various mission centres.

We earnestly seek your prayers and continued support so that the Gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ may reach even more tribal communities in the days ahead.

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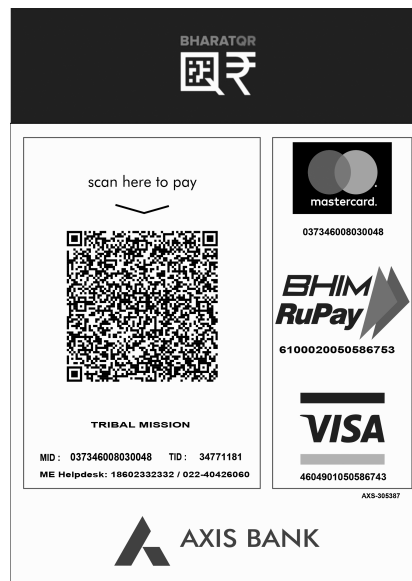
